# Mike's Road to Recovery & Stability

This article is adapted from Mike's full story told from Shannon's perspective.

"I first met Mike at Overflow in January 2020. After I learned that he was a veteran I referred him to our veterans program," shared Shannon who at the time was an Overflow Resident Assitant. After the referral, Mike joined Willis Dady's Grant Per Diem (GPD) program in February 2020. The GPD Program has 10 beds reserved, through a contract with the Veterans Affairs (VA), at our emergency shelter for veterans experiencing homelessness. During this time, Mike was not receptive to case management and struggled with substance abuse. Due to non-compliance with program guidelines, Mike was asked to leave shelter. After being exited from shelter he returned to overflow, which was open year-round in 2020 due to the derecho and COVID. "While back at Overflow I saw that Mike continued to struggle with sobriety and getting into trouble."

A year later, Mike reached out to our veterans program. By that time, Shannon had transitioned into the Veterans Housing Case Management role. Upon reentry into the GPD Program, Mike worked with Shannon to identify his

goals and barriers to housing. Mike was still struggling with his sobriety so Shannon offered him the option of getting clean in order to remain at shelter. He pursued treatment at ASAC and completed their 30-day sobriety program.

Even though Mike was supported in his sobriety, he unfortunately relapsed and was unable to continue in the GPD program. During the exiting process, Shannon told Mike "I can't want this more than you" and encouraged Mike to find options that would support his sobriety and long-term housing stability. Mike applied for Hope CDA's year-long rehabilitation program. Throughout the program Mike kept in touch with Shannon, sharing updates on his sobriety and employment. He has been clean since November of 2021 and graduated in 2022. Upon graduation he got several construction job offers and is still housed. This is the longest he's ever been clean.

Hello, and happy August! As we enter the final weeks of summer I'd like to share a recap of what we've been up to at our Emergency Shelter and what we have planned for the month of August! In the month of June, we had a group of 20-plus youth from the D.C. area who for the 3rd summer in a row partnered with Central Furniture Rescue here in Cedar Rapids. After touring our facilities, they then set up tables in the parking lot of WD to pass out hot dogs, snacks, and water to clients along with individuals experiencing literal homelessnessThe youth group was able to provide 100 meals to the clients we serve between sheltered and unsheltered individuals. We look forward to them returning next summer!



During the month of July, we experienced an increase in single women and families entering shelter. Willis Dady primarily serves single men, but we also have a family wing where we shelter a mix of families and women within 4 apartment size units in shelter. Each family and all single women work closely with our newly hired family case manager Kathleen (Katie). Katie provides one on one case management while focusing on housing with families and single women. After several clients had been denied approval to different housing complexes, Katie submitted appeals where 3 denials have been reversed. 32% of the women in our shelter during the month of July will be entering permanent housing.

Once a month, Trinity Presbyterian Church gathers after a Sunday morning service to assemble Outreach Food Bag kits! For only 30 minutes, 10-20 members of their congregation ranging from 2-70 years old form a packing line to build the kits. In just that short amount of time, their community is able to assemble 100 bags to donate each month! "We heard about this opportunity and felt it was a perfect fit for our congregation."





"Our pro tip is also to use quart-sized zipper-top storage bags! They seem to work well for providing 4-5 food items per bag and also being easy to secure once the bag is packed."

#### Mental Health/Disability Services of East Central Region



### Housing is The Solution Campaign

The common thread that ties all 8 of Willis Dady's programs is our belief in the Housing First model. Housing First theorizes that before someone experiencing homelessness can address the barriers that are impacting their stability (such as financial, health, or social wellness), they need a safe and reliable place to sleep at night. We summarize this model into a simple statement, that "housing is the solution to homelessness". This statement is the spark that Willis Dady staff pass along to our clients as we empower them to gain housing stability.

This fall, we have an ambitious goal to fundraise \$50,000 to meet increased operational costs at our agency. Will you join our mission to empower all experiencing homelessness to build futures of self-sufficiency?
