BRIAN'S JOURNEY TO STABILITY

A childhood of abuse, neglect, severe dyslexia, and drug use set Brian on a rocky path. "The first time I ran away I really expected my parents to be worried about me, to come find me, but... when I came home they didn't even notice I was gone." During this time his drug use grew. "I began smoking pot at 8, I believe I was 11 when I first tripped on acid, and then by 14 I started doing cocaine, 17 methamphetamine, and 19 heroin." Drugs helped Brian survive with little as he escaped his abusive home." After a near death experience from a physical assault and liver failure, Brian asked to be taken to substance use treatment. "If I hit the streets again, I know what is going to happen: I'm going right back to drugs." The next several years continued to be a fight for Brian as he struggled with relapses and setbacks.

Our Street Outreach Case Manager Wes listened to Brian's story, and when Brian shared that he was a bad person, Wes interrupted him and said, "you're a good person, you've just done some bad things." Brian started staying at the Winter Overflow Shelter that year and reflected that "Overflow saved my life a bunch of times; I would have frozen to death out there." A Rapid Rehousing Case Manager worked with Brian to get him on Section 8, allowing him to afford his apartment as his rental assistance ended in our program.



Today 55-year-old Brian has been sober for 18 months, has become a Lead in our Mattress Recycling program, and has remained stably housed. Since 2020 Brian has been working in our Employment Services program through paid opportunities to rebuild stability.

Working at Willis Dady has given him a supportive environment to maintain his sobriety, avoid triggering situations, and drive to make the Mattress Recycling program successful. "It's a safe place to work; we've got nowhere but up to go with it!"

Brian is excited about the idea of moving on from Section 8. He's proud of being able to make more money through employment to cover more of his expenses. "I make enough money to pay for my own groceries, pay for my cat's food, and I can even do more than that now."



LETTER FROM OUR SHELTER DIRECTOR

Beginning this spring we have several client trainings and events coming up! We're excited to have ASAC's Outreach team facilitating our 1st ongoing educational class on substance abuse at our Emergency Shelter. We'll also have Amy from ASAC facilitating our 2nd Trauma Informed Care Training at our Willis Dady Works location. CRUSH Iowa will begin a bi-weekly support group at Shelter. This started with our Veteran clients and recently expanded to all agency clients. Riverview Center will



also reinstate their onsite classes in June at Shelter and Willis Dady Works. These are all needed supports that will assist clients in gaining long term success.

The Overflow season has ended and the shelter closed on March 31^{st.} We had a successful season with many clients making connections to resources such as health care, mental health services, substance use support, connections to shelter, housing options, and case management. We had several clients who worked with rapid rehousing throughout the season and are now housed. On March 28th, a few days before the Overflow Shelter closed, we held an end of season Resource Fair. Several community partners came including Waypoint, Aging Services, ASAC, Linn County Public Health, Iowa Legal Aid, and a local hair stylist who cut over 40 clients hair on this day. We hosted a barbecue and distributed numerous supplies to support clients as the shelter closed.

We also upheld a 6 yr tradition of going out into the community after the end of the Overflow season to pick up trash within the neighborhood. This always allows us the opportunity to thank the neighbors for allowing us to operate the shelter in their community. This year a neighbor came out and passed out snacks as we were picking up trash on his block. The clients and staff all thanked him for his kindness and generosity!
